KENT COUNTY COUNCIL ELECTIONS THURSDAY 6TH MAY 2021

During lockdown Kent County Council and Dover District Council worked together assisting residents experiencing difficulties.

Firstly Clinically Extremely Vulnerable people were contacted offering help. Working with local charities, voluntary groups thousands of food parcels were delivered and numerous families supported with prescription and medication needs.

Conservatives will work on developing and delivering the Reconnect plan to help and support children and young people after the pandemic including supporting youth groups of all kinds.
